## **Guidelines for the Award of Honorary Degrees**

Honorary degrees are conferred by the University in recognition of achievement in an area of endeavour. Honorary degrees are not conferred upon current staff.

Honorary degrees may be awarded to those who meet one or more of the following criteria:

Individuals who have made an outstanding contribution in their field or to the development of their profession, particularly those who

Individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the development of some aspect of community or brought honour to the University or locality on the world stage.

Individuals who exemplify the personal and professional characteristics to which the University wishes its students to aspire.

Individuals that personify the core values of the University.

The University may confer any of its degree awards as an honorary degree, as set out in its
